Proposed bulk entitlement review 2024

Barwon Water is undertaking a series of technical assessments to lead into our bulk entitlement review for the Anglesea borefield.

Project commences

What's involved?

- Develop Bulk Entitlement (BE) review plan
- Consult with key stakeholders (agencies and authorities)
- Engage specialists
- A joint technical expert panel will be established for both BW and Alcoa
- Continue to share updates with our community throughout the project

MAP baseline condition reports

What's involved?

- Develop baseline condition reports using the surface water, groundwater, ecological, acid sulfate soil and land survey data collected under the MAP
- These reports will help inform need for further monitoring assessments

Output

 Revised conceptual models on hydrology, ecological and acid generation processes Monitoring assessment

What's involved?

- Six month pumping test
- Test the updated groundwater model against drawdown, flows and surface water levels
- Monitor for changes in terrestrial and ecological ecosystems, acid generation processes, groundwater quality and land subsidence

Output

 Long term sustainability of extraction Anglesea Groundwater Model

What's involved?

- · Update numerical GW model
- Complete predictive modelling – forecasting various pumping & climate scenarios

Output

- Predicted drawdown, flows and surface levels
- Revised LEVF and PWT groundwater balances
- Revised Anglesea Groundwater Model (numerical model)

Bulk Entitlement review reporting

What's involved?

- Consolidation of reports and monitoring data, addressing requirements of the BE including identifying any potential risks associated with the extraction of groundwater
- Develop bulk entitlement review report and submit to DELWP
- Public consultation period

Notify the Minister of our intention to conduct review July 2022

November 2021 – July 2022

Pumping test commencing in summer 2022

Model completed March 2023

BE review due to the Minister August 2024
